Among the activities that were offered in 2021, the Alliance's traditional Cafés Causettes took place on the last Saturday of the month starting in April. As most of you know, these are an



### Presentation by Léon Malmed

On October 29, 2021, the Alliance Française d'Albuquerque was very pleased to host a Zoom presentation by Léon Malmed, the author of *Nous avons survecu. Enfin je parle*, in which he tells his story about surviving the German invasion of France and the Holocaust during World War II.





It took Léon 60 years before he could write about how he and his sister survived. His hour-long presentation detailed some of his heart-wrenching experiences of survival, as well as moving portraits of love and kindness. After the presentation Léon answered in depth many interesting questions from the audience.

Now at age 84, Léon and his wife Patricia live in South Lake Tahoe, California, and enjoy bicycling, sailing, skiing and golfing. He won a gold medal at the Master National Cycling Championship in Albuquerque in August 2021, as well as another gold medal at the Mt. Diablo Cycling challenge in the Bay area.

The Alliance is very grateful to Mr. Malmed for sharing his remarkable story with us.

# Investigating Impressionism: Monet, Renoir, Degas, Manet, Morisot, Cassatt, Matisse, Cézanne

These are only some of the artists presented by art historian Dr. Susan Benforado Bakewell in her very popular lectures series about many different aspects of Impressionism. Each of the past four lectures attracted more than 50 of our Alliance members and friends, some from



as far as Japan and England. Meeting virtually through Zoom made it possible for all to enjoy her expertise and enthusiasm about the different topics. The presentations explored the architectural, artistic, economic, political, scientific, social and technological contexts in Impressionism of late-nineteenth-century France, particularly in Paris, the Ile-de-France and Provence. Her work as a curator and teacher has taken her many places over the years, and now that she has resettled in NM, we are delighted and so fortunate that she counts involvement with the Board of our Alliance Française d'Albuquerque among her life's pleasures. Her next lecture is scheduled for March, so stay tuned and watch for the announcement.

As you are aware, in March 2020, we had to close the doors of our offices and move all French classes, workshops and cultural events online. Much to our surprise and pleasure, the move has been a success, allowing us to continue teaching and promoting all things French. Yet the costs have not been negligeable. Because we were so optimistic that we would be able to return to in-person classes sometime in 2021, we kept paying rent for both of our classrooms and our library despite not being able to use them at all. So far this year, we again have had to remain entirely online. Since our Zoom classes are shorter and have fewer students than our former in-person classes, our revenue has dropped. Therefore, to help offset expenses, we have made the decision to give up our upstairs classroom, suite 207, and have renegotiated our leases for suites 110 and 211.

The exciting news is that a most charitable sponsor has just donated \$3000 to our Alliance!
